Duties and Requirements:

A strong leader who plans and executes the Hospice vision within the organization and the community, displaying dedication to Hospice values. The Manager is experienced and knowledgeable about life altering diagnoses and the broader field of palliative care, with special emphasis on end of life care. The Manager mentors the Hospice Nurse Educators, and provides collaborative mentorship for all other personnel, physicians, and students working within or directly supporting the Palliative Medicine Program, demonstrating professional values and compassion for patients, families and visitors. He/she develops and promotes relationships within the community with all health partners.

To succeed in this role, you should have excellent analytical, leadership, and problem-solving skills. The successful candidate will also be an exceptional communicator, with a strong understanding of budgeting and performance evaluation processes. Educational /Skill Requirements

- At least 5 years' experience in the field of oncology or palliative nursing, preferably with some experience in community home visiting.
- Management experience preferred.
- Current certificate of competence from the College of Nurses of Ontario
- BScN preferred.
- Certificate in the Fundamentals of Hospice Palliative Care (required) and Comprehensive Advanced Palliative Care Education is preferred
- LEAP- Learning Essential Approaches to Palliative End of Life Care is required or will be expected to complete as assigned after hire.
- Canadian Nurses Association Certificate for Hospice Palliative Care Nursing is required or will be expected to be complete after hire.
- Demonstrated ability to work in a collaborative team environment
- Demonstrated skills of assessment, planning, designing, coordinating implementing and evaluating programs and services.
- Computer proficiency or willingness to learn agency computer programs
- Excellent oral, written and telephone communication skills.
